*Grant. 'Nobby' Arthur David Henry Lewis Able Seaman/Acting Leading Seaman. DSM for making
 secure loose depth charges during a storm . Tied himself to the rail
 and a loose depth charge and waited for the next watch to come and
 assist. At Altmark Incident – His wife was a catholic and he wasn't
 and when he went back after one leave she had bought him a silver
 cigarette case and had his initials engraved on it. It is flat and on
 the top where his initials are there is a little place for matches and
 she asked him to put a Miraculous Medal of the Virgin Mary in it
 to keep him safe. He did so to please her and also put a photo of
 his wife with it. A bullet hit it and it is all bent and you can see the
 impact. He was a bit embarrassed to tell the story
 (COSSACK May 1938 to April 194). See Newsletter 1/2002.
 Joined the Queens Own Surrey's Regiment 1924 (Age 14) (Lance
 Corporal Lewis Gunner) and transferred to the RN 1926 where he

Although not part of the official boarding party was asked to volunteer to release the prisoners so armed himself with a bayonet. Went with Brian Besford to search cabins where they found Captain Starr and Captain Brown. After L03 he joined the Submarine Service. Left the RN as a Leading Seaman

Hope. William. E 'Bill'	Ordinary Seaman. P/JX 171854. Joined 1940 as a Boy Seaman. Y Gun crew. Survivor picked up by Legion discharged to HMS Victory taking passage in HMS Rodney) Left the Navy as a Leading Seaman October 1953. Died 23 July 1996
Hyam. T. (S.)V.	Able Seaman/Acting Leading Seaman. January 1939 to March 1940?
James. John Henry Whitfield	<i>Acting</i> Leading Seaman. P/JX 147419. (Missing presumed killed 23.10.41) Age 22 (single) Son of Arthur Eldred and Ellen Elizabeth James of Cosham, Hampshire
Key. Harold Benson	Acting Leading Seaman. <i>Yeoman of Signals</i> P/JX 144806. (Missing presumed Killed 23.10.41) (married to Yvonne of Basingstoke, Hampshire) son of Mr and Mrs Harry Benson Key
Kirk. Harold. C	Signalman. October 1939 to March 1940? Transferred temporarily from the AFRIDI while she was in refit. Joined the RN as a Boy at GANGES in 1936 becoming a Signal Boy in May 1938 when he joined IRON DUKE. Three months later he was drafted to BARNHAM for 16 months and become an Ordinary Seaman. June 1939 saw him in AFRIDI and apart from the short draft to L03 remained with the AFRIDI until she was sunk by German aircraft NW of Trondheim, Norway on 3 May 1940. July 1940 saw him onboard a French torpedo boat L'INCOMPRISE which had been "captured" from the French Navy at Portsmouth on 3 April 1940. He was rated Acting Leading Seaman before being drafted to PACKENHAM. 6 months later he was rated Acting Yeoman of Signals (Temporary). PACKENHAM was severely damaged 6months later in a battle with Italian torpedo boats at night off Maretime. The ship was taken in tow by the PALLADIN but was bombed the next day by Italian aircraft and had to be sunk by the PALAIDIN. Harold survived and carried on serving until June 1952 leaving as a full Yeoman of Signals. Died 26 th July 2009. He was 88 years old.
Lamb.(e) Cyril Frank 'Ginger'	Acting Leading Seaman. (Temporary.) Onboard as an Able Seaman at October 1939. Senior ASDIC rating. DSM. ((London Gazette 25 November 1941page 6772) for Operations Style and Substance) P/JX 146508. Died on HMS Legion (Buried at sea from HMS Carnation 24.10.41) Age 22 (single) Son of Frank and May of Wolverhampton . Sister Mrs. Eileen Codd. Cyril attended St Peter's in 1931 followed by his sister a year later. Parents ran The Summerfield., New Hampton Road West, Whitmore Reans, in 1921. Butlers, who owned the pub then, had let Cyril's parents stay there, putting up with the mess and keeping the pub open, while they did a big modernisation, kicking them out when the job was finished and putting in a younger man. Cyril's father, Frank with wife May, moved to the Coach and Horses, Snow Hill, and later to the Criterion, in the centre of the town.

Able Seaman Lambe was on the bridge at the time of the attack, and was seriously injured but swam for some time through the oily seas to be picked up by HMS Carnation. Because HMS Legion had a surgeon lieutenant on board it was decided to ship all the seriously wounded by small boat to the Destroyer. It seems that Able Seaman Lambe was still alive when picked up and that only one of the wounded died on HMS Legion. Eileen said how her brother was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal and that her mother and father were invited to Buckingham Palace to the investiture. May, Eileen's mother went forward to receive the medal from His Majesty King George IV who asked her if she was there by herself. She said, no, that her husband was in the crowd at the back of the room. His Majesty had Frank, May's husband, brought forward and said to him. "You should be up here, to share his honour."

Frank and May Lambe, Cyril's parents presented a pew to be placed in the Lady Chapel of St. Peter's Church

Captain of the Mess Onboard at January 1939. Badly burnt (See account by Ray Davies who says Raggy was put ashore at the Azores with one other) (Missing presumed Killed 23.10.41) Age 23 (married to Jessie Featherstone of Maltby, Rotherham, Yorkshire – Best man Reg Bower) son of John Thomas and Eva May Marshall 93 Victoria Street,, Maltby.. Joined the RN at 15. Prior to COSSACK served on COURAGEOUS and ROYAL OAK.
Martin. S.F.	Leading Seaman. January 1939 to March 1939?
Masterton. J. W. B.	Acting Leading Seaman. Temporary. P/JX 150284. (Survivor discharged to HMS Victory taking passage in HMS Rodney)

Redman. Harold 'Harry'	Leading Seaman.(May have been Acting Rate) Able Seaman Torpedo Operator. P/SSX 23737. Born 23 May 1918. Joined RN 1936. Joined L03 1939 to 1941. (At BISMARCK action) (Survivor picked up by Legion after 12 hours on a Carley Float and discharged to HMS Victory taking passage in HMS Rodney) Was behind the funnel when the torpedo hit. One of two crew who disarmed the depth charges on the Quarterdeck. Left the

	RN at the end of the war and worked as an electrician for NHS hospitals in the Southampton area. Died 22 December 2005

Scott. Charles H.	Leading Seaman P/JX 127913. 1938 – 1940. Acting PO at Altmark Incident. Joined at Newcastle during building of L03. Left L03 after 2 nd Battle of Narvik. Captain of 'B' 4.7 gun. <i>Purchased Pluto –the ship's dog- for half a crown in Malta.</i> Died 30 August 2003 aged 92
*Smithen. 'John' 'Hank' Harry Edward	Able Seaman/Leading Seaman P/J 82983. Quartermaster 14 June 1938 remaining on ships books until 1 April 1941. May have done the dhobing for PO Writer Yell. (Survivor discharged to HMS Victory) Born 28.10. 1901 Ware Hertfordshire. (GRO reference number is 3a 610) Lived in Bognor Regis. Now deceased. Married to Helen
Suggett. A.	Acting Leading Seaman. October 1939 to March 1940?
Taylor. Fredrick John	Leading Seaman. P/JX 139122
